Reader: A reading from the First Letter of John

We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us-- and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help?

Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him.

And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

Distribution of Holy Communion

The wine is administered from either the main chalice or the gluten-free (GF) chalice. Standard reception is to take a sip from the cup. If you do not wish to sip from the cup, you may intinct (instructions to follow), or you may cross your arms over your chest to signify you do not wish to receive the cup (or you may always leave the rail before the cup comes to you). Remember that communion in one part is still full communion. If you wish to intinct (dip your wafer in the wine), leave your wafer in the open palm of your hand. The chalice minister (with a gloved hand) will intinct your wafer for you and return it to your open palm. GF wafter and chalice are available—let the celebrant (priest) know at the communion rail.
